1. State and prove the fundamental theorem of differential calculus. A third degree polynomial passes through (0,-1),(1,1), (2,1), and (3,-2). Find the polynomial. 5+5=10

2. Given 5+5=10
 $\log_{10} 654 = 2.8156, \log_{10} 658 = 2.8182, \log_{10} 659 = 2.8189, \log_{10} 661 = 2.8202$
find $\log_{10} 656$. By means of Lagrange's formula prove that
$$y_1 = y_3 - .3(y_5 - y_{-3}) + .2(y_{-3} - y_{-5})$$
